In Conroe ISD, we encourage all students to read over the summer in order to enrich learning and provoke thought. Summer reading strengthens reading skills, increases academic achievement, fosters a love for reading, and empowers students to become life-long learners.

This summer, we want you to choose at least **one book of your choice** and keep a log of your thinking while you read. Reading experts note that most young readers suffer a backslide in reading skills during the summer. Research shows that a consistent amount of reading each day (30-45 minutes) will increase reading and comprehension skills and benefit you in every subject.



While you read **your selected book** this summer, respond to your reading through some form of writing. You may have a journal and jot down your thoughts. You may have a sketchbook where you draw doodles and pictures as you read. You may use sticky notes and write about your characters as they change throughout the novel. **The choice of how you respond to your reading is up to you.** [We have provided some examples on the back of this page.](#)

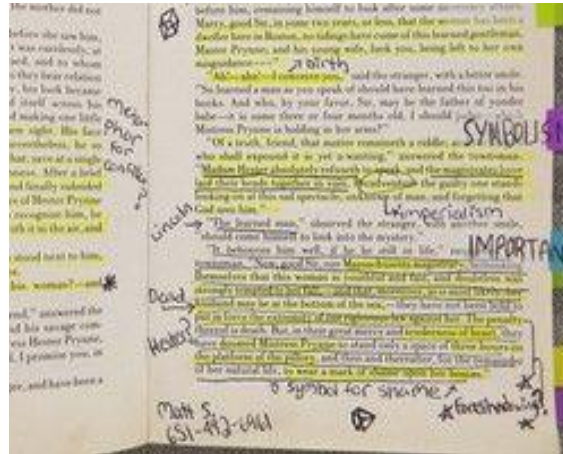
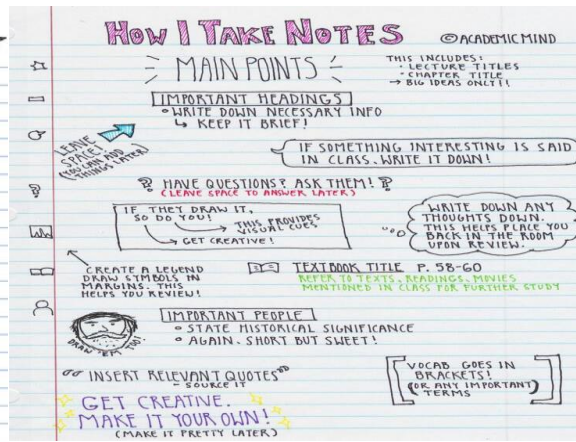
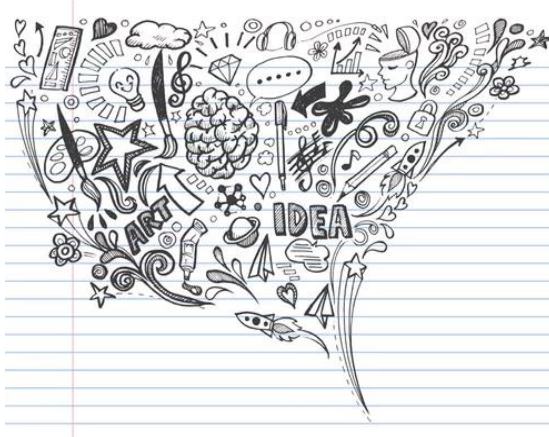
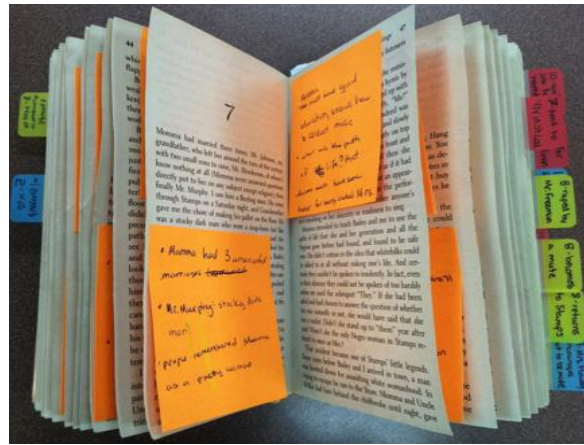
Upon your return to school, you will be expected to:

- Conference with your teacher about your book. You will demonstrate your understanding of the novel as well as share your journaling notes at this time.
- Engage in a class discussion regarding key points of your novel. The type of questions that may be asked include (but are not limited to):
 - What is the main problem that the character must overcome? How was this problem resolved? Were you happy with the conclusion?
 - If you found yourself in a similar situation/conflict that the main character faces, how would you react?
 - What does your novel teach you about resilience and overcoming obstacles?
